SPECIAL AREA NEWS

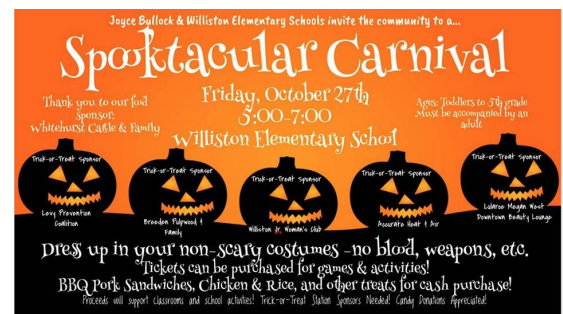
